



Ryder Skinny Scarf

(NitaB&NishaN)

This luxurious quick knit uses just 1 skein of yarn!

Instructions:

Skill Level

Beginner

Finished Measurements

59 ¼ inches x 2 ¾ inches

Yarn

Knitpicks Gloss DK
70% Merino Wool, 30% Silk
50g, 123 yds
1 skein Cranberry

Needles

US7 (4.5mm) straight

Gauge

4sts = 1 inch

Notions

Tapestry Needle

- Cast On 11 stitches (using cable cast on method).
- **Rows 1 - 6:** Knit (ending on a WS row).
- **Row 7:** Knit2, *(YO, k2tog)* repeat until 1 stitch remains, knit1.
- **Row 8:** Knit.
- **Row 9:** Knit (when you get to the YO hole from row 7, knit directly into the YO hole of row 7 but drop the stitch that is sitting on row 8)^.
- **Rows 10 - 12:** Knit.
- Repeat Rows 7 through 12 until scarf measures 58¾ inches (54 repeats).
- Knit 2 more rows, ending on a WS row.
- BO Loosely (RS), Weave in loose ends.
- Blocking is optional.

Stitches Used (Abbreviations):

Cast On (CO)	Knit (k)
Yarn Over (YO)	Knit 2 together (k2tog)
Bind Off (BO)	Garter Stitch (knit every row)
Right Side (RS)	Wrong Side (WS)
Cable Cast On (www.nbnndesigns.com/videos)	

Notes: Gauge, finished measurements and photograph were taken before blocking. Different yarn weights can easily be substituted by adjusting needle size according to your gauge. Gauge and swatching are not crucial for this project, but if desired, knit a swatch in garter stitch (knit every row) to obtain gauge.

^ Instead of knitting into the stitch (above the YO) on row 8, knit into the hole caused by the YO in row 7 (i.e. pull yarn through the hole) but drop the stitch on row 8.

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
